Barred Sallow (Tiliacea aurago) *	3	Macro	Resident. The larval foodplants are maple and beech.
Beaded Chestnut (Agrochola lychnidis) *	41	Macro	Resident. The larvae feed on unspecified grasses and low growing plants.
Black Rustic (Aporophyla nigra) *	2	Macro	Resident. Larvae feed on heather, petty whin, dock, dandelion and foxglove.
Common Marbled Carpet (Dysstroma truncata) *	3	Macro	Resident. Larvae have a wide variety of food plants.
Diamond-back Moth (Plutella xylostella) *	1	Micro	A resident and immigrant species. Larvae feed on turnips, cabbages and allied plants including sea kale. Also associated with marsh yellow-cress.
Dingy Dowd (Blastobasis adustella) *	1	Micro	Resident. Larvae have been found to feed on fresh, decaying or dried vegetable matter.
Feathered Thorn (Colotois pennaria) *	1	Macro	
Green-brindled Crescent (Allophyes oxyacanthae) *	6	Macro	Resident. Larvae feed on hawthorn, sloe and garden apple.
Large Yellow Underwing (Noctua pronuba) *	6	Macro	Resident reinforced by regular immigration. Larvae feed on unspecified garden vegetables and flowers.
Light Brown Apple Moth (Epiphyas postvittana) *	1	Micro	Resident. First recorded in Sussex record in 1984. The species originated from Australia. Larvae feed on a huge variety of flowers, shrubs and crops.
Merveille du Jour (Griposia aprilina) *	4	Macro	Resident. Larvae feed on oak.
November Moth agg. (Epirrita dilutata agg.) *	2	Micro	
Oak Rustic (Dryobota labecula) *	1	Macro	Resident. Larvae feed on evergreen oak amongst significant areas of foodplant. A new species for me!
Red-green Carpet (Chloroclysta siterata) *	3	Macro	Resident. Larvae feed on oak, ash, apple and sallow.
Red-line Quaker (Leptologia lota) *	4	Macro	Resident. The larvae feed on Sallow and willow (including grey willow).
Rush Veneer (Nomophila noctuella) *	2	Micro	Immigrant appearing each year in widely varying numbers. Larvae feed on clover and unspecified grasses.
Straw Dot (Rivula sericealis) *	2	Macro	Resident sometimes reinforced by migration. Larvae feed on unidentified grasses.

Turnip Moth (Agrotis segetum) *	1	Macro	Resident sometimes reinforced by immigration. Larval foodplants are the roots of turnips and swedes and some other garden and farm crops.
Vine's Rustic (Hoplodrina ambigua) *	13	Macro	Resident and immigrant species. The larval foodplant has not been recorded in Sussex.
White-point (Mythimna albipuncta) *	12	Macro	Immigrant and episodic resident. Larvae feed on unspecified grasses.
Yellow-line Quaker (Leptologia macilenta) *	1	Macro	Resident. The larvae feed on oak, beech and hawthorn.
